

HURRICANE FOSTER CARE

In the event of an emergency wherein it is necessary for the HSCC to temporarily evacuate the animals from the shelter, the undersigned agrees to the following:

- I shall serve as a “foster parent” in the event of an emergency.
- Upon being contacted by the HSCC of an emergency evacuation, I will immediately go to the shelter to obtain my foster animal(s).
- I will keep the animal(s) safe, properly sheltered, fed and watered.
- In the event of an illness or injury to the fostered animal while in my care, I will obtain the necessary medical treatment and with paid receipts will be reimbursed for treatment expenses.
- When it is safe to do so, I will return the fostered animal(s) to the HSCC shelter.

In the event of an evacuation, I would be able to foster the following:

HURRICANE FOSTER PARENT GUIDELINES

All potential foster parents must fill out an application and be approved by the Shelter Manager.

Foster parents will obey all local and state laws regarding animals.

Foster parents will be responsible for keeping the animal safe, sheltered, fed and watered.

Foster parents must report any bite cases to the local law enforcement agency and contact the emergency phone number for the Shelter Staff as soon as possible.

All animals will receive a cage, food/water dish and enough food for a day, if needed. Foster parents will be responsible for providing food and water.

When it is safe to do so, all animals will be returned to the Humane Society Shelter upon return to the area.

If the Humane Society is damaged, the foster parents will keep the animal until the Shelter is operational again.

Applicants should notify the Shelter as soon as possible, if they no longer wish to be on the foster list. It is very important that we have a dedicated list of foster parents.

Once a hurricane is imminent the foster parent list will be called and put on stand-by.

Once the stand-by call has been made, the foster parent should let the shelter staff know as soon as possible when they will pick up their foster animal(s).
