- * HSCC was awarded a grant from the Bissell Company which is designated specifically for spays and neuters! Our goal was to use these funds to off-set the adoption fee for our animals in the hopes of increasing adoptions! This grant assisted with OVER 200 ADOPTIONS! We have officially depleted the funds of the grant, so adoption rates are back up to their normal rates.

- * Hurricane Dorian gave Camden County a little scare! You will be interested to know that HSCC has a well thought out, designed, and routinely used "Hurricane Preparedness Plan". As soon as there is a named storm, the HSCC Board of Directors are in constant contact with calls, emails, and meetings to stay ahead of the storm in order to keep the animals safe.



Should the storm make landfall within our area, it is our goal to empty the shelter by transferring as many animals to our sister shelter in Albany and through Hurricane Fosters. These Storm Troopers were instrumental through Hurricane Dorian. For circumstances beyond their control, Albany was unable to take any of our animals, which left us to rely on Camden County and the Storm Troopers, and you all did not disappoint! In just 3 short days, we were able to empty the entire shelter of ALL animals (approximately 150+ animals)!!!!!! HSCC employees and the Board of Directors cannot thank the community enough for helping us keep the animals safe through the storm! In addition, the hurricane sleepovers resulted in 20+ "foster failures" meaning the families loved their animals so much they failed to bring them back and chose to adopt them instead!

* Be on the lookout for the 2020 Paw Partners campaign! It is one of the biggest fundraisers we do each year. As you may recall from Orientation, we receive 50% of our operational costs from the contract we have with Camden County. The other 50% to operate the shelter comes from direct donations from the community. The donations continue to come in and every dollar will help us ensure as many homeless animals as possible are helped in 2020. Please consider becoming a Paw Partner if you have not done so
